

EMERGENCY ACTION QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

GENERAL EMERGENCY PRINCIPLES

In any emergency situation, Montgomery Community College's overriding goals are to:

- 1. Protect life safety
- 2. Secure critical infrastructure and facilities
- 3. Resume normal operations

EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS

During an EMERGENCY (fire, medical, accident, hazardous spill) always **CALL 911**.

To reach CAMPUS SECURITY in a non-emergency, call 910-898-9600 to reach the switchboard.

MCC's ALERT SYSTEM

ReGroup is the college's mass notification system, which uses a variety of methods to contact students, faculty and staff in the event of an emergency/school closing. To check the accuracy of your contact information in our system, or to add additional contact methods, login to the Emergency Notifications portal through MCC TechTrail on our website (www.Montgomery.edu).

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

If trained, begin First Aid. **CALL 911** and have another person meet police/rescue at a designated area to escort responders to the victim.

FIRE ALARM/ACTUAL FIRE

Fire in building- evacuate are/activate fire alarm if not sounding already. **CALL 911** from assembly point.

NOTE: Individuals needing assistance during an evacuation are encouraged to develop personal action plans.

DO NOT return to building until "ALL CLEAR" is given by first responders.

NATURAL DISASTER/INCLEMENT WEATHER

WEATHER WARNING: Severe weather has been reported Seek shelter in designated Safe Areas. Stay away from windows and avoid large rooms

WEATHER WATCH: Conditions are favorable for the development of severe weather. Make a plan to deal with potential severe weather should it arrive.

VIOLENT INCIDENT LOCKDOWN/SHELTER IN PLACE

During a violent incident (or potentially violent incident) by an angry person or persons threatening with a gun or deadly weapon, a Lockdown Response is used when it may be more dangerous to evacuate the building than to stay inside.

When an Active Shooter/Aggressor is in Your Area:

1. RUN:

Have an escape plan Leave your belongings behind Keep your hands visible

2. HIDE:

Hide in an area out of the shooter's view Block entry to your hiding place and lock doors Silence your cell phone

3. FIGHT WHEN YOUR LIFE IS IN IMMINENT DANGER:

Attempt to incapacitate the active shooter

Act with physical aggression and throw items at him/her

4. CALL 911 when it is safe to do so

BEHAVIOR OF CONCERN

IF YOU SEE SOMETHING SAY SOMETHING! If you notice behavior of concern in students, staff, faculty or visitors, please notify your supervisor, the Counseling Center (student) or Human Resources (employee) depending on the situation.

Responsibilities of the Emergency Response Team:

- Ensure employees are trained annually.
- Upon hearing an alarm, communicate the alarm (verbally) in your current areas. If you are needed in other locations, you will be notified.
- Know where all exits are for the building assigned to you as well as accessible exits.
- Know the evacuation locations/exits so you can direct everyone out of the building safely. Do not allow loitering for any reason.
- Remember that life safety, incident stabilization, and property and environmental concerns are the priorities....in that order!
- Be observant of anything out of the ordinary. Use all your senses. Report anything suspicious for follow-up.
- Clear building using verbal communications, if required.
- As the buildings are cleared, be certain someone is stationed at each entrance to ensure no one re-enters the area, if required.
