

## Required Documentation for Students with Special Needs/Special Accommodations/Disabilities

Students with special needs/special accommodations/disability requests are required to check in with the Counselor each semester in order to obtain reasonable accommodations for their classes and complete necessary forms.

Documentation of the special needs/accommodations/disability will be used to evaluate requests for reasonable accommodations and/or auxiliary aids. The evaluation process will include the impact of the documentation on the goals and standards of the program, course, and/or activity. As appropriate to the special needs/accommodations/disability, the documentation should include the following:

- ✤ A diagnostic statement identifying the special need/accommodations/disability, date of the most current diagnostic evaluation, and the date of the original diagnosis.
- $\clubsuit$  A description of the diagnostic tests, methods, and/or criteria used.
- A description of the current functional impact of the special needs/accommodations/disability, which includes specific test results and the examiner's narrative interpretation.
- Treatment, medications, and/or assistive devices/services currently prescribed or in use.
- ✤ A description of the expected progression or stability of the impact of the special needs/accommodations/disability over time, particularly the next few years.
- The credentials of the diagnosing professional if not clear from the letterhead or other forms.

## Although helpful, an IEP is not sufficient for documenting a disability or receiving reasonable accommodations.

A disability under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act is described as a mental, or physical impairment that substantially limits a major life activity.

Examples include:

- ✤ Attention-Deficit/Hyperactive Disorder
- Blindness/Visual Impairment
- Deaf/Hard of hearing
- Learning Disabilities
- Physical Disabilities
- Psychiatric Disabilities
- Speech and Language Disabilities
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Other disabilities that include conditions affecting one or more of the body's systems.
