Admission into Practical Nursing (PN)

Admission to the Practical Nursing program is based on completion of all of the following Phase I and II admission requirements. It is the **student's** responsibility to ensure that all documentation including testing and/or courses completed is transmitted to the Admissions Office. Prospective students are not considered for admission until all paperwork and all assessment benchmarks are complete and verified through the Enrollment Office.

Phase I: Application deadline January 15

- **Apply**: Complete NC residency determination at www.ncresidency.org before applying online at www.ncresidency.org</a
- **Request transcripts**: Submit a high school/high school equivalency certificate (GED®)/Adult High School transcript that meets North Carolina standard and any necessary college transcripts. (MCC reserves the right to test for proficiency any applicant asking for transfer credit on theory or clinical course.)
- **Nurse Aide I**: Must have completed or currently attend a state-approved NA I training program and provide proof of NA training and active registry listing to the Admissions Office. If currently participating in a NA I class, a NA Enrollment Verification form must be submitted by January 15 and a copy of the NC Registry Listing must be on file in the Admissions office by July 1. NC Registry Listing must be maintained while enrolled in program.
- **Placement**: Using the Reinforced Instruction for Student Excellence (RISE) placement model, students must be eligible to enroll in ENG 111 and MAT 110 WITHOUT a co-requisite for the PN nursing program by January 15. See Placement options below. It is the student's responsibility to ensure documentation of appropriate test scores or course completion is received by the Admissions Office by the deadline.

Phase II: Admissions (TEAS) - February

Admissions Test: Applicants who have completed all Phase I admissions requirements by the application deadline will be eligible to take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) admission test. After the application deadline, qualified applicants will be notified of their eligibility, cost, and MCC TEAS testing schedule. Upon recommendation of the Admissions Office, applicants may retest through ATI however, retests offered at MCC are not guaranteed. MCC does accept outside TEAS scores that meet admissions criteria, that are sent to the Admissions Office directly from ATI. Scores within the last three years are eligible for review. Any TEAS tests taken after June 1st, 2022 must be the most current, Version 7 of the test.

Phase III: Provisional Acceptance

After all criteria for Phase I and II have been satisfactorily completed, applicants will be evaluated for provisional acceptance. A point selection process will be used to rank applicants for acceptance into the program. Applicants will be ranked based on (1) TEAS scores; (2) previous secondary and post-secondary academic work; and (3) county of residency. Applicants will receive written notification from the Admissions Office concerning provisional acceptance or placement on the PN alternate list. Acceptance is provisional pending the following requirements:

- ➤ **Orientations:** Attendance is required at mandatory orientation sessions. Many aspects of the program will be discussed and include, but not limited to tuition, books, schedules, program expectations for class, lab and clinical. Failure to attend could result in forfeiture of position in program.
- ➤ CPR: Be certified with Basic Life Support CPR prior to PN registration. CPR certification must be maintained throughout enrollment.
- ➤ **Medical form:** Completion of student medical form and evidence of physical and emotional health as defined by the North Carolina Board of Nursing Standards for Educational Unit in Nursing. Qualified applicants will be provided the medical form when required.
- ➤ Background/drug screen checks: Affiliating agencies used by MCC's PN program require students to submit to criminal background checks, drug testing and/or health screening prior to or during participation in class, lab, clinical, or co-op experiences at their sites. Students should be aware that progress toward graduation may be limited by any inability to meet the agency requirements for student placement

Academic Requirement

Nursing students are required to maintain at least a 2.0 GPA (a "C" average) to remain in the program with a grade of "B" or better on each nursing course and BIO courses.

Applicants for Readmission

Readmission to the Practical Nursing program is based on successful completion of the requirements for readmission and space availability. A student may be admitted to the PN program only twice, including re-instatement.

Reapplication for Subsequent School Terms

If you are not accepted into the program or if you are accepted but decide not to attend and wish for your application to be considered for another academic year, <u>you must reapply for admission by completing a new application</u>. *Your file will not be considered unless you reapply.* You should reapply as soon as possible or by January 15 for the next school year.

Transfer Applicants

Positions are sometimes available for students from other nursing programs. All students applying for transfer to MCC should complete the application process by October 1. Any transfer credits must be a grade of "B" or above and be evaluated by Student Services and Practical Nursing Staff prior to entrance. The College reserves the right to test any applicants requesting transfer credit on any theory or clinical course. Students will be required to score an 80 on the nursing competency exam before transferring in.

Related Courses

Prior to acceptance into the nursing program, students may enroll in the related courses. By passing these related classes ahead of time the course load in nursing the following year will be reduced. However, completing related courses early may impact financial aid awards. Students should consult the financial aid staff for more information.

Being enrolled in these related classes, however, *does not guarantee a position* in the nursing class for the following year. Each applicant will still have to compete for the available positions using the regular nursing admissions criteria. Applicants who have completed related courses at other institutions should contact the Registrar's Office at MCC concerning their transferability.

Financial Assistance

All nursing applicants are encouraged to apply for financial aid assistance. For more information, contact the Financial Aid Office at MCC or visit www.fafsa.gov. Scholarships and veteran's benefits information is also available. MCC does not participate in the Stafford Loan program. Please be aware that financial aid does not cover the entire cost of this program.
