Fees:

COURSE DESCRIPTION

SPECIALITY NON-CERTIFICATION

1. Premier Extrication – Patient/Vehicle Movement
 - a. The course will consist of real-world tactics and strategies used in freeing entrapped occupants from vehicles. Training will include opportunities to work with vehicles in various conditions and positions. All students MUST provide appropriate PPE.

FIREFIGHTER CERTIFICATION

2. FIP3042 Fireground Ops 2
 - a. This course includes instructional content for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1001: Standard for Firefighter Professional Qualifications (2019 edition). All students must provide full PPE, an SCBA and a spare bottle.
3. FIP3600 Emergency Vehicle Driver
 - a. This course deals with the safe operation of emergency vehicles, driving skills, legal implications of emergency driving, departmental standard operating procedures, and abilities to satisfy the key requirements of NFPA 1002: Standard for Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications (2017 edition)
4. FIP6505 Helicopter Transport
 - a. This certification-related course in helicopter transport will present to the Technical Rescuer (TR) general operating and safety guidelines when working with helicopters at emergency scenes for the protection of on-scene emergency providers, flight crews, and the civilian population.

NATIONAL FIRE ACADEMY

5. Incident Safety Officer
 - a. This 2-day course examines the Safety Officer's role at emergency responses. A specific focus on operations within an Incident Command System (ICS) as a Safety Officer is a main theme. Response to all-hazards types of situations will be emphasized. Students MUST register for or have an NFA SID before taking this course.
6. Leadership in Supervision
 - a. This course presents the participant with the basic leadership and supervisory knowledge, skills and tools needed to perform effectively in the fire and EMS environment. Students MUST register for or have an NFA SID before taking this course.

NATIONAL FALLEN FIREFIGHTER FOUNDATION

7. **Courage to be Safe**
 - a. Courage to Be Safe is designed to change the culture of accepting firefighter fatalities as a normal occurrence by examining the 16 Firefighter Life Safety Initiatives. Promotes the courage to make the right decisions to help ensure that Everyone Goes Home.
8. **Leadership, Accountability, Culture and Knowledge**
 - a. Leadership, Accountability, Culture and Knowledge explores how fire department leaders can improve firefighter survivability by examining the root causes of line-of-duty deaths.

FIRE SERVICE NON-CERTIFICATION

9. **Basic Driver Operator**
 - a. This course will offer the basic concepts required of a new driver/operator. The course will identify the basic concepts of pump operation and flowing water at the fire scene.
10. **Basic Firefighter**
 - a. This course will offer the new fire fighter basic skills in many topics. Attention will be given to Personal Protective Equipment, Hose Line Operations, Ladders, etc... Hours from the session may be used by your department in fulfilling requirements for the NC Volunteer Firefighter Practical Skills Task Book. All students MUST provide full PPE, an SCBA and two (2) spare bottles.
11. **Advanced Techniques for Moving Hoselines**
 - a. This course will provide both new and experienced firefighters the opportunity to learn new techniques in advancing uncharged and charged handlines of varying sizes under varying conditions. The use of large muscle groups will allow firefighters to better move hoselines under extreme conditions. All students must provide full protective clothing including, pants, coat, gloves and helmet.
12. **LP Gas Props – Day of Fire**
 - a. This session will be divided into two sessions on Saturday. Each will be a four session of burn time with our three LP gas props (Bulk Tank, Meter Housing and Forklift). Students should indicate if they would like Session 1 0800-1200 or Session 2 1300-1700. Choose one (1) session ONLY to allow others to take part. There will be a \$35.00 non-refundable fee required for this course. Students MUST provide full PPE, SCBA and a 2 spare SCBA bottles. Select course as 12-1 or 12-2.

EMS

13. **NAEMT Advanced Medical Life Support**
 - a. Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS) remains the gold standard of education for emergency medical assessment and treatment. Endorsed by the National Association of EMS Physicians, AMLS emphasizes the use of the AMLS Assessment Pathway, a systematic tool for assessing and managing common medical conditions with urgent accuracy.

SEARCH AND RESCUE

14. Land Navigation and SARTopo

- a. Students will learn the techniques of following a route through unfamiliar terrain using maps, reference points and a compass. Students must bring a laptop, tablet, and phone to be used as tools to assist in understanding the importance of technology in land navigation. This course will combine the elements of both courses into a four-day event.
