Marvin (Doc) Bennett joined the military in 1984 as a Combat Medic. After Basic Training and Advanced Individual Training, he was assigned to a Mechanized Infantry Battalion. On his first assignment he was selected as the Battalion Soldier of the Year. During this assignment he was invited to attend the NC Counter Drug Task Force Special Reconnaissance Operations (SRO) Team selection process. After being selected, Doc was assigned as the senior team medic. While there, he was also given the opportunity to lead missions, and finally, he was assigned as a Law Enforcement Liaison. In this position he advised local, state, and federal law enforcement on surveillance techniques, handgun selection, illegal drug eradication and other specialty operations.
